What is a Source?

- A source is the item from which you get information
- It can be a book, a letter, a person, an interview, a document, even yourself.
- Evidence comes from the information found in the source.



What is a citation?

- You use the information found in the source to support a particular fact or assertion and provide enough details in order to locate the source.




Sources in The Master Genealogist

- In The Master Genealogist (TMG) sources are listed in the Master Source List.
- At the top of the screen, click on Tools, then in the drop down list choose Master Source List.
- The Master Source List will open up.

At the top of the window:

- To filter by datasets
- You can choose all datasets
- Or choose one of your existing datasets



Next, you can sort by:

- Abbreviation
- Source Number
- Title
- Default Surety



- Abbreviation is a short name for your source that is meaningful to you and helps you locate the item in the list.
- Title is the full name of the source.



Source Types

- TMG sources are based on source types from the book “Cite your Sources” by Lackey
- Or “Evidence!” by Elizabeth Shown Mills



When TMG is first installed

- It is set for the default source type of custom initialized to the Mills type of sources, giving you many source types to choose from.
